Before anyone gets alarmed thinking I have gone off mission, your regular puddle light update is here! The recently announced 911 Club Coupe has a new puddle light design. At this point, I cannot be persuaded that these puddle lights are not a new revenue stream that is about to explode in growth.



This became clear to me when I realized that the decision to put the lights in the bottom of the doors defeats half of the purpose of their existence. When approaching your vehicle at night, you will only see the illumination from the puddle light *after* opening the door, but at which point you will have already stepped into the now illuminated puddle that wasn't there when you parked the car.

How could such an oversight have occurred during the design phase? My belief is that the bottom of the doors was the only approved location because any other spot, such as the bottom of the mirrors or door handles would have raised the vehicle's center of gravity. This means that all conscientious Porsche owners should take a topographical image of the parking spot with the door open so that you can safely approach if it is dark upon your return.

I now understand that I've spent way too much of my life thinking about puddle lights, but I'm sure there will be another new design to coincide with the next Porsche model update. Maybe by then I will have moved on to a new design element to captivate me.

I hope to see all of you at an event soon!

PAST PRESIDENT'S NOTE

his month let's delve into Porsche's mid-engine heritage, a design philosophy that has defined some of the brand's most agile and driver-focused models. Starting with the 914 in the 1970s—a collaborative effort with Volkswagen that introduced affordable mid-engine



fun to enthusiasts—the layout placed the engine between the axles for superior balance and handling. This evolved into the beloved Boxster in 1996, which revived the roadster spirit with its flat-six power and precise dynamics, and later the Cayman, a hardtop coupe that amplified performance with a stiffer chassis. Today, the 718 series continues this tradition, blending turbocharged efficiency with Porsche's signature thrill. These midengine marvels highlight the company's innovation in weight distribution and cornering prowess, making them favorites for track days and spirited drives alike. Whether it's the entry-level accessibility of the 914 or the refined power of the modern 718 GT4, Porsche's mid-engine cars remind us why engineering excellence remains at the heart of the brand.

On a personal note, on the mid-engine theme, I recently had a great experience at the Mecum Auction in Harrisburg, PA, that tied into my passion for unique automotive finds. While browsing Facebook Marketplace for parts to advance my 911 project, I got a notification from a car forum about a rare 1988 Pontiac Fiero Mera going up for bid

that very day. So, I quickly registered as an internet bidder and, about 45 minutes later on August 10th, won the lot—it was surreal to later spot myself as the "internet bidder" when the auction aired on TV. Leon and I turned the pickup into a memorable father-son road trip to Harrisburg, where we loaded up this yellow gem and brought it home. For those unfamiliar, the Mera was a limited-edition conversion of the mid-engine Pontiac



Fiero, created through a partnership between select Pontiac dealers and Corporate Concepts Limited. Starting in 1987, this was a dealer option straight from Pontiac; they replaced the Fiero's plastic panels with fiberglass bodywork designed to mimic the Ferrari 308, complete with optional replica wheels and interior tweaks, but retaining the original 2.8L V6 and mechanics. Only 247 were produced (88 in 1987 based on the Fiero GT and 159 in 1988 on the Formula model) before Ferrari sued for trademark infringement over the striking resemblance, winning the case and halting production. Priced around \$24,000 to \$28,000 new—half the cost of a real 308—it became a rare collectible, and this Giallo Fly Yellow example with a 5-speed manual is a fun addition to the garage, especially given its mid-engine layout that echoes Porsche's own engineering ethos. As always, thanks for the club's encouragement; let's chat about your latest adventures at the next meetup. Here's to more unexpected treasures and Porsche pursuits!



Remembering our good friend Dick Gobba

April 19, 1937 - August 9, 2025

first met Dick and Shirley
Gobba in the early 1990s as
part of the Detroit Motor Cities
Gruppe 356 Club and I was
immediately drawn to them
because of their immense
enthusiasm not just for the
cars but for engaging with the
people in our club. I always had
a hard time figuring out who
was more enthusiastic about
the cars, was it Dick or was it
Shirley?? Shirley is more vocal
about her love for the cars and
club, but you could always tell













that Dick was right there with her in that respect when you got the chance to chat with him.

You might not know it but over the years he and Shirley have owned a couple of pretty significant cars, the first one being a 1952 356 Cabriolet that Shirley bought at a farm auction for \$10. That's not a typo and it's not even the most amazing part of the story. That story is for another time but to give you a teaser, in 2010 as part of their 60th-anniversary celebration in America, Porsche

Cars North America conducted a "My Porsche Classic Search" to find the oldest models sold in the US. That very car, now owned by Dr Robert Wilson of Oklahoma City, was found to be the earliest known Porsche sold in the United States. The next car was a 1957 356 Speedster, beautifully restored and



lovingly owned and cared for by them. We did a photo shoot of the car for the Auspuff Roar (The newsletter for the Motor Cities Gruppe) in the early 2000s and some of those images you see here.

His funeral service was lovely; it was held at the quite beautiful Immanuel Lutheran church in Palmyra, MI. The pastor told heartfelt stories abut Dick and Dick's grandchildren read a touching tribute to their grandfather. People were there not just from his community, but from all over the country

The procession was very touching as well; the oncoming traffic all pulled over with their flashers on to let us pass by. One gentleman even got out of his car and stood with his head down and hands folded in a beautiful show of respect for a community member no longer with him.

Arriving at Deerfield Cemetery I immediately noticed the VFW Honor Guard standing at attention waiting for everyone to arrive (Dick, if you didn't know, was a proud Marine who served overseas). It was a beautiful sunny day and the trees, fields and flowers were in full bloom. The Honor Guard played Taps and gave Dick a 21 Gun Salute, a fitting sendoff for a great man who will be sorely missed.

Another Porsche Parade has come and gone and around 25 people from the zone made the trek to Oklahoma City for the fun times. Oklahoma City turned out to be a very pleasant venue with several excellent museums and parks, the memorial for the Oklahoma City Bombing, and Native American influences all around.
