


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New Porsche 911 Club Coupe celebrates 70 Years of PCA — 70 cars for 70 members





PAST PRESIDENT'S NOTE

If this is your first winter with a Porsche—or even your twentieth—here are a few reminders to make sure your car is protected and ready for spring startup:

- **Battery tender:** Don't gamble on a spring surprise. If your car will sit for more than a few weeks, a battery tender is one of the best investments you can make. AGM-specific versions are ideal for most newer Porsches.
- **Fuel stabilizer:** If your car won't be started monthly, adding stabilizer before your last fill-up will help prevent ethanol-related issues.
- **Tire care:** Inflate tires slightly above normal pressures to prevent flat spots. If you're serious, consider tire cradles or even lifting the car slightly to unload the suspension.
- Detail and cover: Wash, wax, and fully dry the car before putting it away.
 Use a breathable cover—ideally one that doesn't trap moisture—and avoid plastic tarps at all costs.
- **Pest patrol:** A dryer sheet or two in the cabin, frunk, or engine bay (aircooled folks, take note) can discourage unwanted winter tenants.
- **Keep it driven, if you can:** If the roads are dry and salt-free, don't be afraid to take a winter drive now and then. A car in motion is a happy car—just be diligent with your post-drive cleanup.

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If you've got any garage tips of your own—or better yet, a photo of your Porsche in "hibernation mode"—send them my way for a future club feature. These cars were built to be driven, but they also deserve a good nap when the weather turns.

On a personal note this month, I continue to make progress on the EV 911 build, and the motorcycle lineup is holding steady... for now. Winter might mean less road time, but it's also prime wrenching season.

Until next time—bundle up, charge up, and as always, drive (or store) responsibly.





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


Porsche Design Unveils the Chronograph 1 - PCA Member Edition
